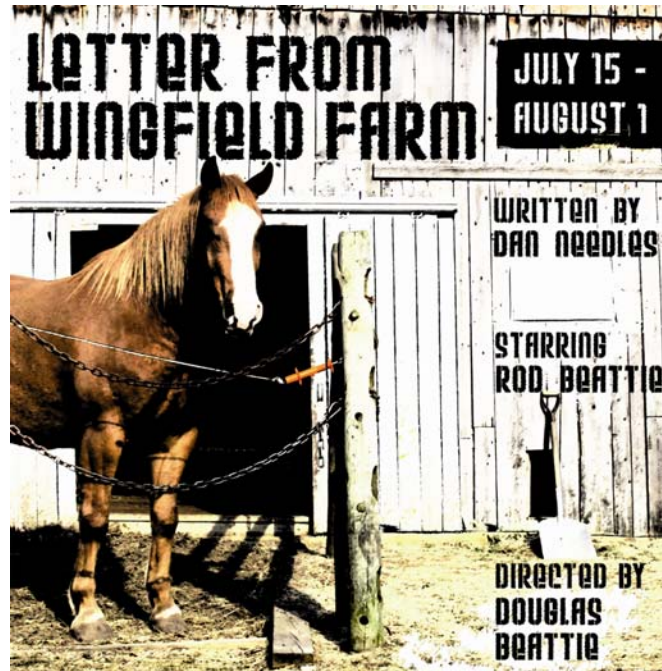

Theatre Nova Scotia is a registered charitable organization.

Our registration number is 1906 3394 RR0001.

Theatre Nova Scotia was founded in 1949. An organizational outline is on the adjoining panel. A complete annual report is available on request. As the provincial service organization for all forms of Theatre, the development of theatre as a cultural activity is part of our mandate. From time to time our members, members of the theatre community, and their supporters raise funds to carry out projects and programs that benefit the artistic life of our community. Theatre Nova Scotia will act as a co-sponsor where the benefit to the community is clear as is the case with the establishment of the **Valley Summer Theatre** in Wolfville, Nova Scotia.

This project is in aid of the establishment of a new professional theatre in Wolfville, Nova Scotia called the **Valley Summer Theatre**. At present there are no actively producing professional theatre companies in Wolfville, a community that has a proven desire to support a company. The presence of a professional summer theatre would be of great benefit to the community.

### **Vision**

For live theatre to thrive in Nova Scotia.

### **Mission Statement**

To provide a voice for professional theatre and community theatre in Nova Scotia, and to encourage and support all aspects of live theatre through programs and services.

### **History**

Theatre Nova Scotia has a long and proud tradition of promoting and creating theatre and theatre artists in Nova Scotia. Incorporated in 1949 as the Nova Scotia Drama League by an act of provincial legislature, the organization underwent a significant reorganization in 2001 when it joined with the Nova Scotia Professional Theatre Alliance to become Theatre Nova Scotia. The organization now is the primary resource and advocate for all theatre in the province.

### **Membership**

Theatre Nova Scotia has a membership of 18 professional theatre companies, 25 community theatre companies and over 100 individual members. Our members and member groups come from all regions of the province and represent all levels of practice (amateur, professional, educational).

### **Programs and Services**

Theatre Nova Scotia operates a number of programs and services aimed at facilitating the practice of theatre. Theatre Nova Scotia produces Onstage OnLine, a weekly electronic theatre news bulletin that has a wide distribution, which include members, national theatre organizations, and government representatives. We also maintain an extensive resource listing, lending library, and website. Theatre Nova Scotia produces the Robert Merritt Theatre Awards this country's only provincial professional theatre awards, produces a number of theatre brochures and publications, and operates a performance/rehearsal space in Halifax.

### **Education**

Theatre Nova Scotia is a managing partner in *Perform* a joint initiative with Dance Nova Scotia, and the Nova Scotia Choral Federation that brings together practicing performing artists with teachers and students in public and private schools across Nova Scotia. Through *Perform* students and teachers have opportunities to work with professional actors, dancers, and choral musicians to explore and develop their own skills and creativity. Theatre Nova Scotia also manages the Nova Scotia High School Drama Festival an annual event that brings high school students from across the province together with theatre professionals for a three day work intensive.

### **Infrastructure**

Theatre Nova Scotia offers its facilities such as meeting rooms and office equipment free of charge and its photocopying and postage machines at cost to its member groups. This is of great benefit to emerging theatre companies and numerous individuals who take advantage of these resources.
